FLOOD PRECAUTIONS

ORGANIZE BEFORE WATER COMES:

Form from within a Disaster Management Committee that helps you in making your voice heard, clear their roles (which may include sharing of trustworthy warning, smoothen evacuation, safer shelter, provision of basic health, facilitating food for people in need, and fodder for livestock). The committee also must map danger zones, identify safe high ground, shelters, and evacuation means and routes, too.

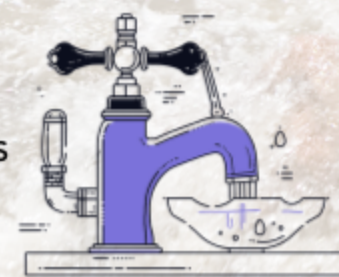
1. Do share the Safeguard shelters and infrastructure with people from your vicinity.

And suggest them to only move to places with raised platforms do not stay in mud-made houses.



2. Secure Water And Sanitation

1. Mark historic flood lines
2. To make sure that your drinking source is safe, or an alternate is arranged timely.
3. Pre-stock chlorine tablets, ORS, and soap.
4. Where temporarily settled, do arrange emergency pit latrines.



3. Do monitor you gauge polls and Early warning communication

Spread only trusted warnings by mosque loudspeaker, siren, megaphone, or WhatsApp groups.



5. Stock shelters with traps

1. When evacuating, carry along Ropes, clean water containers, ORS, chlorine tablets, and dignity kits.
2. Make sure to build or reinforce raised platforms for livestock and fodder.
3. Prepare a list of people along with their age, health, and gender to help aid workers in reaching out to the most in need



4. Evacuation and movement

1. Move out the vulnerable first, old people, people with disabilities, pregnant women, and kids.
2. Pair up households so each family looks after another. That way, no one gets left behind.
3. Keep tractors, boats or carts ready for moving people and animals.



6. Protect health and dignity in shelters

1. If staying in temporary camps, set up a child-and women-friendly space where you stay.
2. Keep a small health desk with ORS, basic meds, first aid, and referral contacts.
3. Enhance a simple code of conduct to prevent harassment and ensure safety.



7. Recovery after a flood.

1. Wait for administration clearance before re-entering homes.
2. Clean and disinfect houses and the drinking water source.
